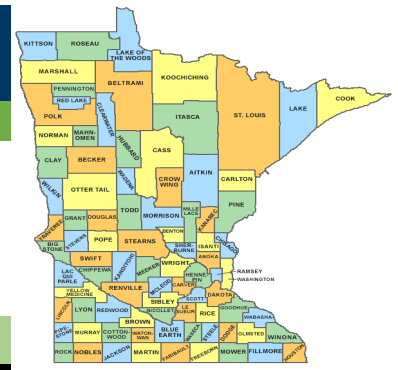


COUNTY PROFILE

Watonwan Co.

Watonwan Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 9, which is located in the Southwest Planning Region.



POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

2021 population: **11,135 people**

Watonwan Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2021, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Watonwan Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 1).

Watonwan Co.'s population decreased over the past decade, ranking as the 46th fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2020. It is now the 65th largest in the state. Watonwan Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

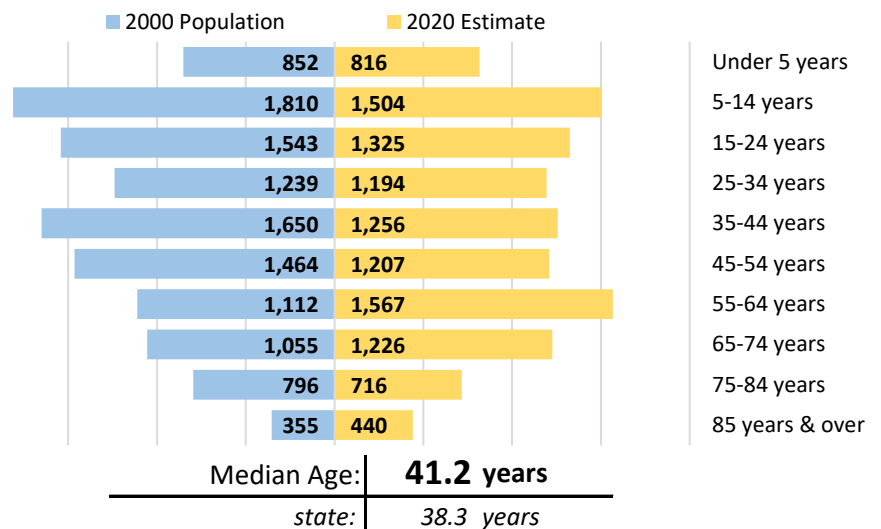

Figure 1. Population Pyramid, 2000-2020

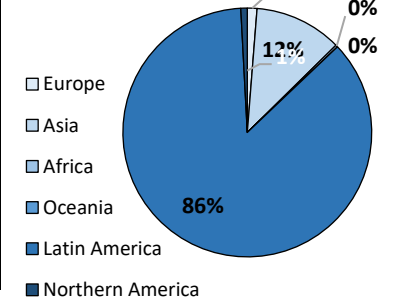

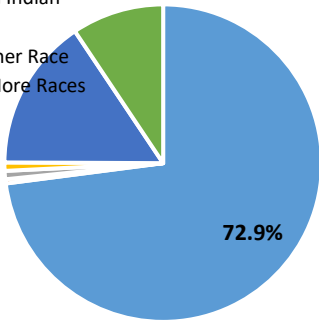
Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2020

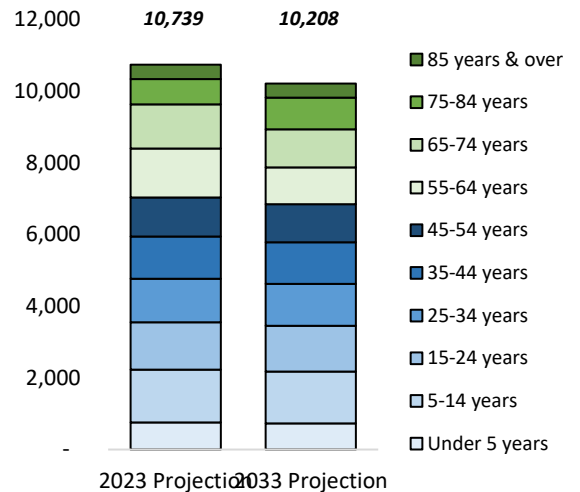
POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Watonwan Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2023 to 2033, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (5.6%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to decrease over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Watonwan Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.8%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Watonwan Co. also has a lower percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

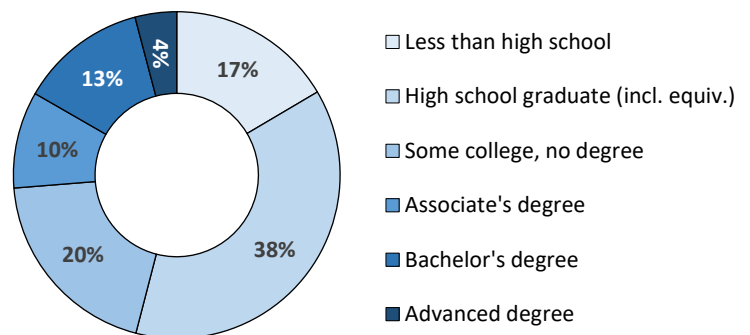

Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2020



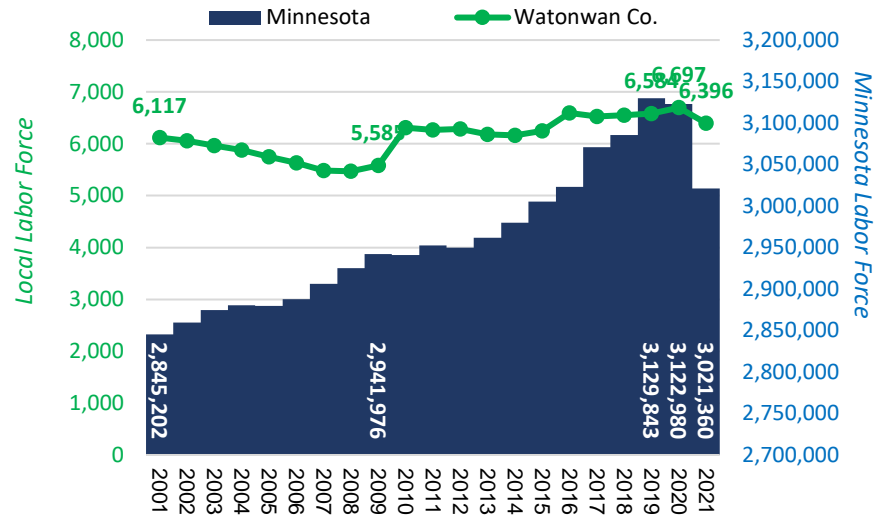

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3%, Watonwan Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2021. After the pandemic recession Watonwan Co.'s unemployment rate decreased compared to 4.8% in 2020, and declined compared to the 4.3% rate posted in 2019, pre-pandemic. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Watonwan Co. declined over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

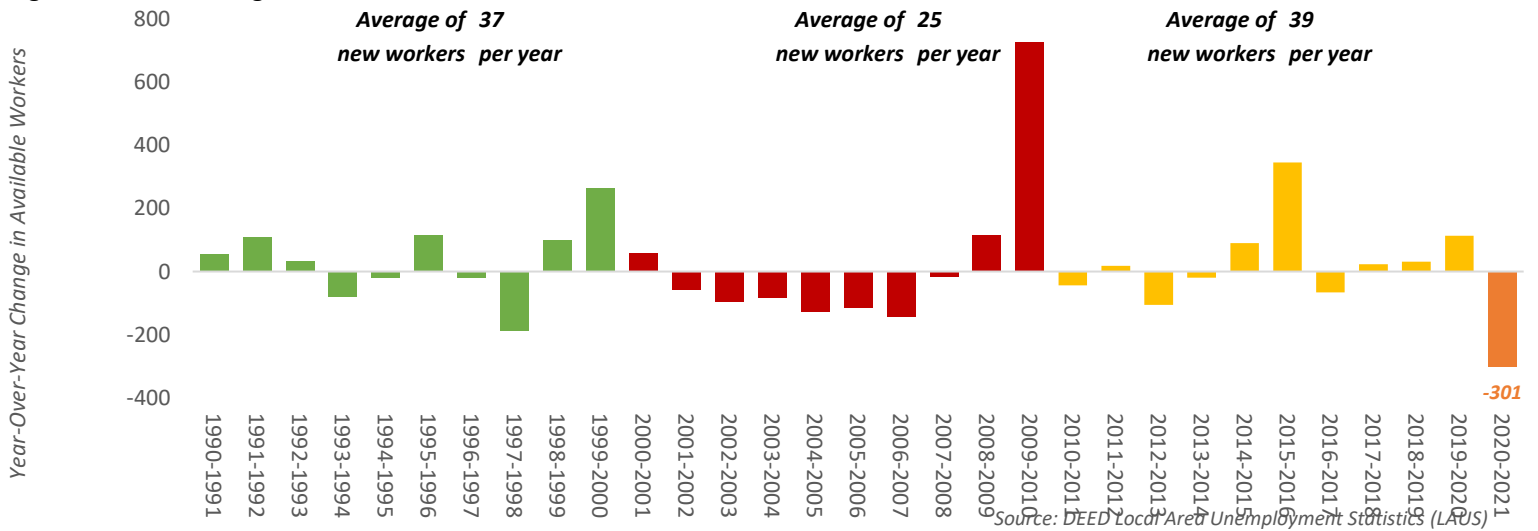
Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of 36.6 workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Watonwan Co. averaged an annual gain of 25.2 new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of 38.6 new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Watonwan Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2023 to 2033 (see Table 6).

Figure 7. Annual Change in Labor Force, 1990-2021



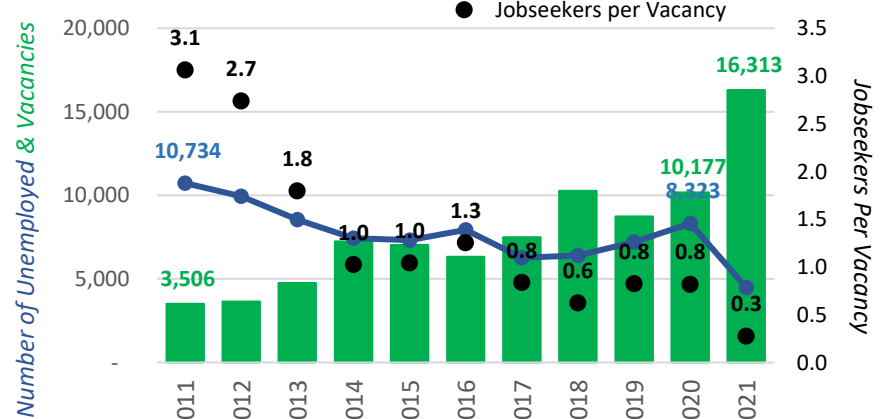

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. Job vacancies in Southwest reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).

LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

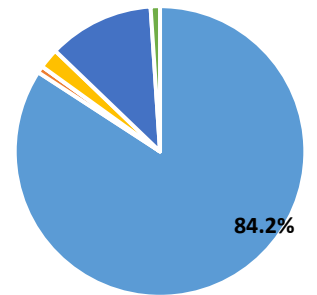
Watonwan Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Watonwan Co. is more racially diverse than the state (where 84.8% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

Figure 9. Labor Force by Race, 2020



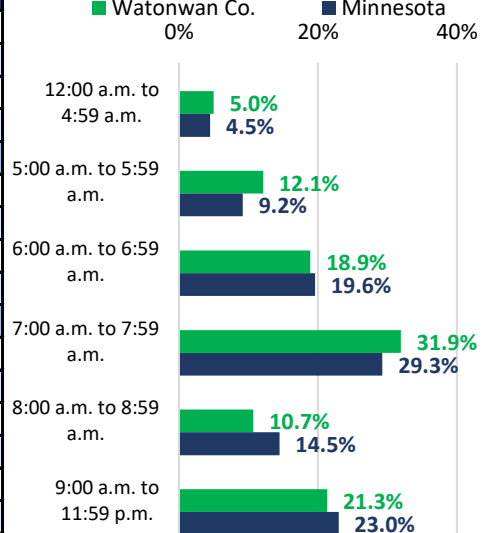

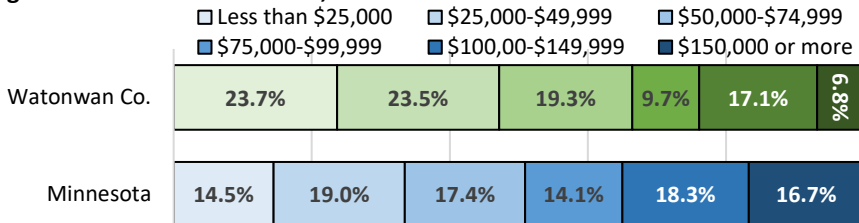
INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

The cost of living has increased over the past year with costs up in many areas. Watowan Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$14.23 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$15.12 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

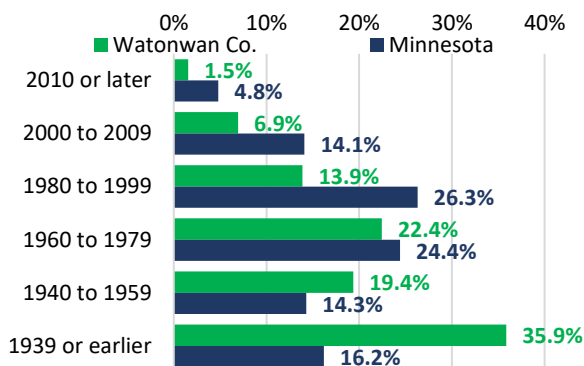

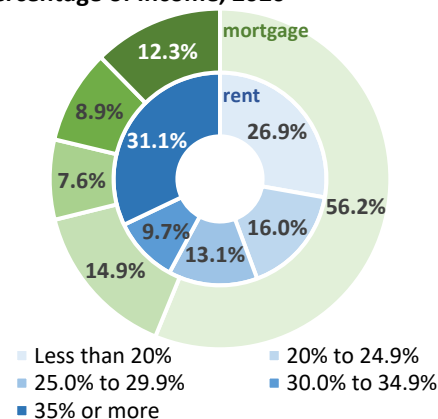

OCCUPATIONS

At \$21.92 in 2021, wages were lower in Region 9 than the state. Overall, Region 9 had the 7th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$43.1) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$13.89) (see Table 11).

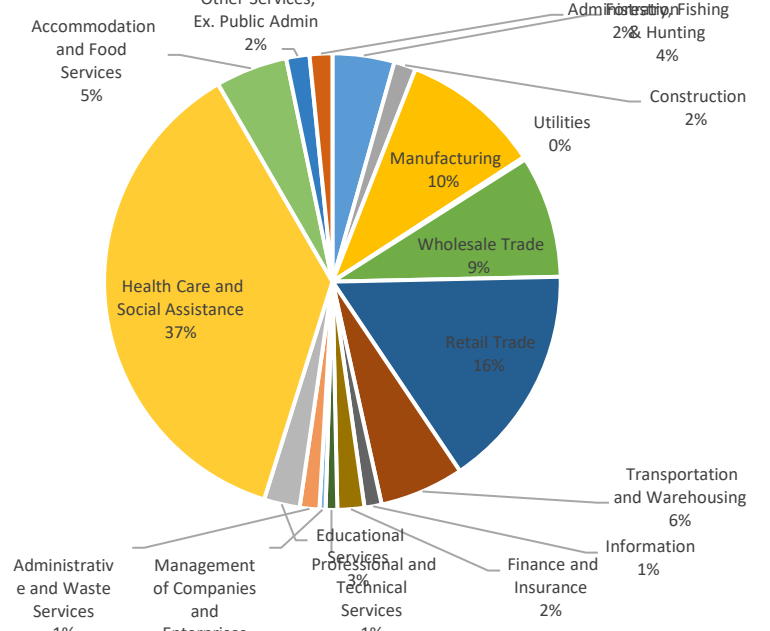
JOB VACANCY SURVEY

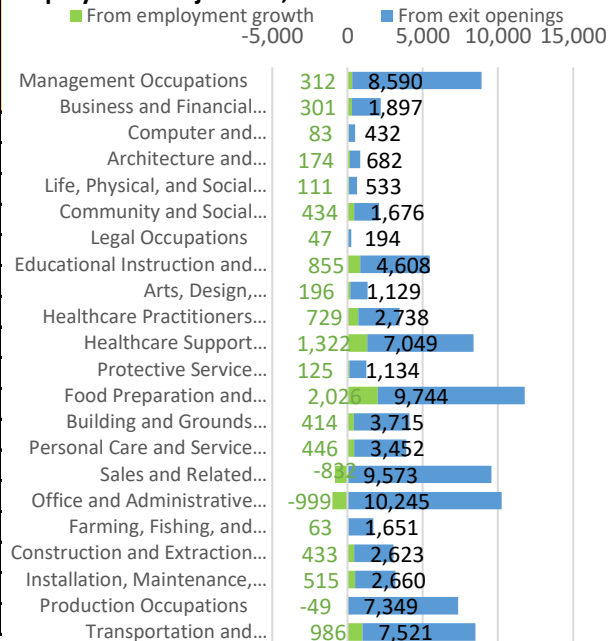

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Watonwan Co. had the 62nd largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Watonwan Co. was the 42nd fastest growing in the past year and the 8th fastest growing since 2019, prior to the pandemic. From 2019 to 2021, employment in Watonwan Co. grew despite the pandemic recession.

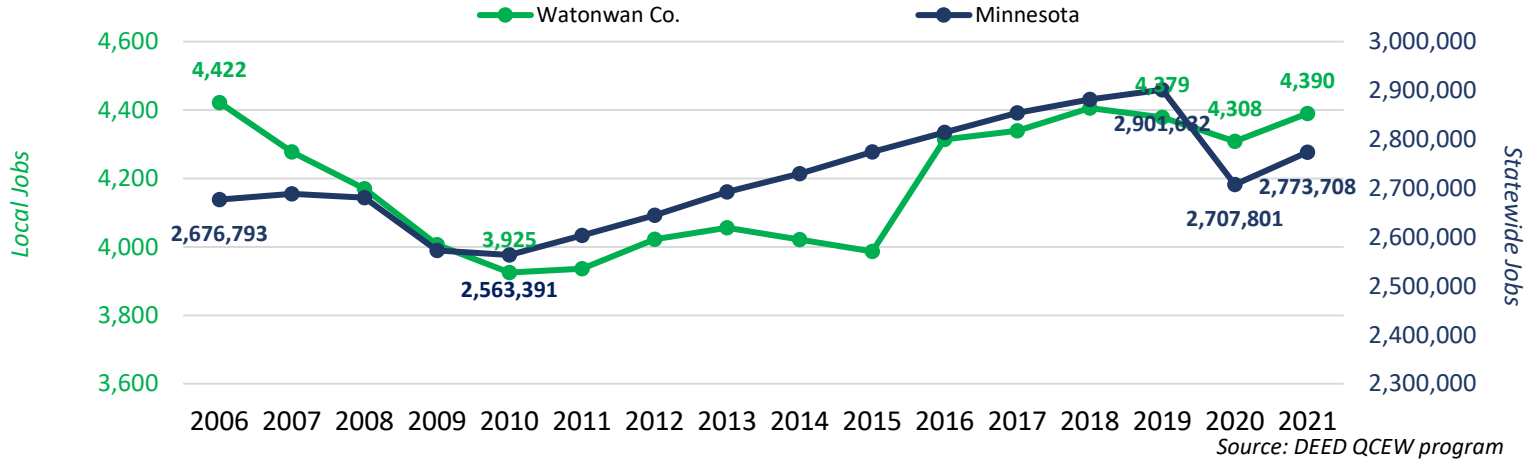

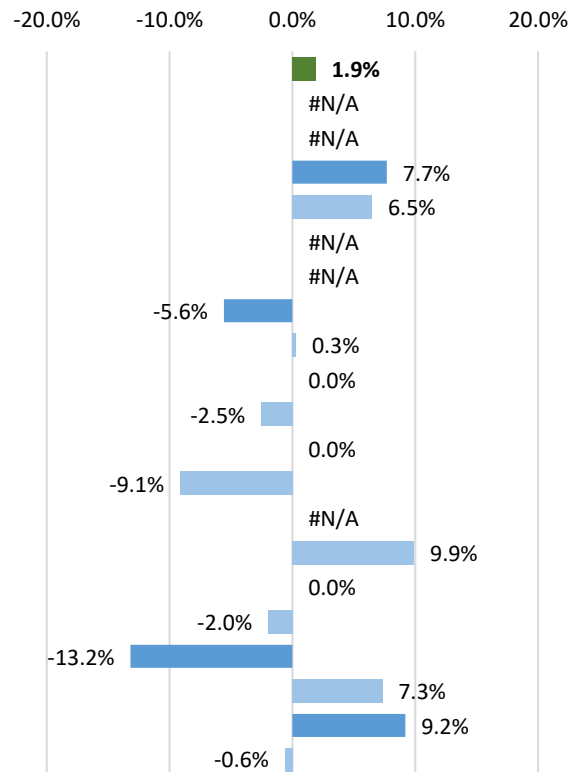
